Major Accomplishments

Training: OAC-CAO hosted a workshop at the NMSU
 Teaching Academy entitled "How are we doing? A Beginner's
 Guide to Non-Academic Program Assessment" on February 16,

2017. The presentation identified the many reasons assessment is important to NMSU, defined assessment terms, introduced real campus assessment projects, and discussed the role of WEAVE in assessment reporting. 33 NMSU employees registered for and attended the presentation. Attendees represented many departments including: Career Services, Facilities and Services, Student Engagement, Aquatic Center, Student Success Center, Outdoor Rec, Fire Protection Services, etc. The presentation was recorded and can be used for future training. To accompany this presentation, the subcommittee developed a handbook/handout entitled, "How are we doing? A Beginner's Guide to Non-Academic Program Assessment." The handbook reflected the spirit of the presentation but contained additional, in-depth information that readers can use to plan, implement, and report assessment.

- 2. Website Revisions: In an effort to meet our goal of updating the OAC-CAO website, OAC-CAO formed a small subcommittee (5 members) to plan and implement this task. The focus of the sub-committee turned to redesigning the Office of Assessment website in support of the NILOA Excellence in Assessment Designation application. Committee members met weekly during Spring 2017 to review peer institutions' websites, brainstormed various structures for the site's information architecture, and drafted mock designs. While we did not meet the goals outlined at the annual retreat, the committee made progress on an overall redesign.
- 3. Outreach: The committee piloted a new approach to assessment outreach that involved conducting interviews with representatives from co-curricular, operational, and administrative areas. On April 19, 2017, 4 committee members met with leadership from Facilities and Services to learn more about Facilities and Services' goals, assessment activities, and to help them identify areas in which they are already conducting assessment but have not submitted a report through WEAVE. Another focus of the interview was training; committee members educated leadership about the importance of closing the loop and telling their story through assessment. The interview resulted in a report being developed in WEAVE to capture Facilities and Services' assessment activities. OAC-CAO plans on developing and replicating this interview process with additional departments, including units from SAEM in Summer 2017.

- 4. Scoring: Assessment report scoring is a major function of OAC-CAO. OAC-CAO members met in December 15, 2016 to score 8 assessment reports submitted by co-curricular, administration, and operational areas. This was the first year OAC-CAO scored reports electronically. Scoring involves reviewing and providing feedback on individual assessment reports. OAC-CAO members identified 3 exceptional reports for additional review by the University Outcomes Assessment Council (UOAC). UOAC selected 1 report to receive the OAC-CAO Excellence in Assessment Award. The award was presented at Spring 2017 Convocation to the Center for Learning and Professional Development.
- 5. Support for EIA Application: OAC-CAO conducted an environmental scan/analysis of Assessment websites that were recognized by NILOA for their excellent design and informational architecture. This was OAC-CAO's introduction to NILOA and the Excellence in Assessment Designation process. Three OAC-CAO members served on the NILOA Excellence in Assessment Designation Core Application Team. Other committee members were invited to review the narrative throughout the application process. The Director of Assessment submitted the EIA Designation application on May 1, 2017.
- 6. Assessment Consultation: Members of OAC-CAO participated in a meeting with Linda Suskie on May 17, 2017. The Office of Assessment invited Ms. Suskie to campus for a workshop and consulting. The consulting meetings resulted in a 4-page report with observations about assessment at NMSU and suggestions for improvement.

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
